## **Chicken Pot Pie...submitted by Dee Charest**

This is quick, easy and very, very good.

1 cup cubed cooked chicken  
1 can Cream of Potato soup  
1 can Cream of Celery soup  
½ cup milk  
¼ tsp. dried Thyme  
¼ tsp. Pepper  
1 small bag frozen mixed veggies, thawed or (1 can of mixed veggies)  
2 prepared pie crust. You can use either the Pillsbury brand pie crust that comes folded or you can use the Deep Dish frozen pie crust.

1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees
2. Line the bottom of your pie crust with one of your pie shells and poke holes in it with a fork. (If you're using a deep dish frozen pie shell, you'll have to let it get softened before poking the holes or it will crack your crust.
3. Spread some soft butter over the top of your bottom pie crust and bake for about 5 minutes.
4. Mix all ingredients together in a bowl. Pour into pie shell.
5. Cover this with your second crust.
6. Pinch the edges of the two crusts together and cut a few small slits in the top crust.
7. Bake for about 1 hour or until the top crust is brown and pie is bubbling.
8. Let stand for about 10 after removing from the oven.

## **Adjusting Thermostat Damper Doors**

When replacing the damper door thermostats or performing any other task that requires the removal of the bottom shrouds, returning the connecting rod swivel to the damper door bracket can be a real task.

The shop manual says to open the door fully, pull the rod back against the stop, adjust (etc.) and finally remove the shroud (held at this point by two bolts), hook up the rod and finally, replace the shroud. At that point, your are pulling the shroud forward against the tension of the thermostat, trying to line up the bolt holes and get the front of the shroud where it belongs. All this time you are mightily cursing the perversity of inanimate objects.

There is a better way. Install the shroud, bolting it in place using all six bolts. Now the rod is inside the shroud unconnected and the damper door is flapping loose. Using a pair of Vice-Grips pliers, grab the rod as far forward as you can reach from below the damper door.

Now pull the Vise-Grips (and the rod) rearward against the stop, adjust the threaded swivel as necessary, put the retainer clip over the damper door bracket, slip the swivel in and fasten the clip. Now hold the damper door open and release the Vice-Grips.

Note: The Vice-Grips must clear the bottom edge of the damper door when pulling the rod to the rear. This is necessary so that the thermostat can be pulled all the way to its stop as per the manual. Adjust the Vise-Grips as needed to eliminate this problem.

## **Vacuum Leaks...Written by Paul Jones**

**1978 Communiqué**

Put some small hose clamps on the short rubber hoses on each end of the intake manifold crossover tube. This prevents a symptom that is intermittent and very had to diagnose. That symptom is short periods of lost power on hot days. The heat hardened rubber expands to create an air leak that goes away when you pull over, as the engine cools. Spend about 0.25 cents per clamp (*remember this was written in 1978*) and save some rattled brains.
